LOOKING FOR AN AFFORDABLE PLACE TO LAY OUT YOUR "HOME, SWEET HOME" WELCOME MAT? IF SO, SOUTHWEST MICHIGAN IS A GREAT CHOICE.

Among the 269 urban areas that participated in the 2020 Cost of Living (COL) Index published by the Council for Community and Economic Research, the after-tax cost for a professional/managerial standard of living ranged from more than twice the national average in downtown Manhattan to 25 percent below in Harlingen, Texas. Southwest Michigan's geographical center—Kalamazoo, Michigan—continues to rank as one of the most affordable places to live in the nation boasting a cost of living that is 22.2 percent less than the national average.





HOW DO WE STACK UP?

Cost of living is often top of mind for those considering a relocation for work or family. Employers too gather location intelligence on the communities in which they operate or are considering for investment.

While other communities advertise a low cost of living, Southwest Michigan makes that claim based on fact: the community has the second lowest cost of living in the nation as confirmed by the COL Index. Affordable housing in the Kalamazoo area is the top driver for landing it at the top of the list, as well as low prices at the grocery store and for miscellaneous expenses like hamburgers, pizza, movie tickets and more!
