Willett Distillery rolled the first barrel out of its facility on March 17, 1937, a date still revered as the brand's birthday. By the 1940s, the inaugural Willett Family Bourbon, Old Bardstown Kentucky Straight Bourbon Whiskey, was in production and available to local consumers. In 1964, the same year that the United States Congress named Bourbon America's Native Spirit, Willett Distillery was awarded a gold medal from then Kentucky Governor, Edward Thompson Ned Breathitt, for its Old Bardstown product.

Today, Willett Distillery produces several unique spirits, but the product that is easiest to identify is the iconic Pot Still bottle. The Willett Pot Still bottle is an exact replica of the patented Willett pot still built by Vendome Copper and Brass. Like the family business that crafts it, this small batch whiskey has evolved over time, carrying forward traditional flavors and adding the mark of the fifth generation.

Imperial Beverage is a long-standing member of the Michigan beverage distribution community. Established in 1933 after the repeal of prohibition and purchased by Kalamazoo's Cekola family in 1984, Imperial has grown from a one county beer distributor to a top 10 statewide beer, wine, and spirits wholesaler.
